This interactive course, run by <u>Research</u> <u>Podcasts</u>, will provide you with the knowledge and skills required to set up, launch and run a podcast, or to participate as a guest or host. It will cover:

- apps, software and hardware
- hands-on audio editing practice
- how to put together a podcast episode including recording and mixing in theme music

You will be given a template to develop your ideas for the format and content of your own podcast, and will get feedback on your ideas from experienced podcasters and colleagues.
